Hushed and magical landscapes are the setting for steaming geysers, trees covered in ice crystals, and the movements of bison, elk, pronghorn, bighorn sheep, and other wildlife—followed closely by the park's wolves.

Safari aboard custom vehicles with expert naturalists as we explore and learn about the animals, ecosystem, geothermal activity, and history of the park. Program Highlights:

- * Immerse yourself in the unspoiled natural beauty, diverse wildlife, and dramatic tales of this unique ecosystem during this exclusive small group expedition to Yellowstone in winter.
- * Scout for wolves from the warmth of a heated vehicle—Yellowstone is considered the best wolf-watching habitat in the country.

Day-by-Day Itinerary*:

Day 1: Arrive in Jackson, WY

Welcome to Jackson! This evening, during a welcome reception, get to know your traveling companions and Orbridge Expedition Leader as you discuss and anticipate your upcoming adventure.

Overnight: Rustic Inn at Jackson Hole Creekside Resort & Spa (R)

Day 2: Jackson / Old Faithful

Today, depart for Old Faithful, traveling through the Grand Teton National Park to Yellowstone's South Entrance where we change vehicles for a specially equipped snow coach. This afternoon, watch Old Faithful erupt, then enjoy a nature walk to the Castle Geyser and Upper Geyser Basin.

Overnight: Old Faithful Snow Lodge (B,L,D)

Day 3: Old Faithful / Mammoth Hot Springs / Gardiner, MT

Head to Mammoth Hot Springs, a unique area of the park where colorful travertine terraces create mesmerizing, intricate landscapes. During a stop at the Lower Geyser Basin, discover the four geothermal features of the park: hot springs, mud pots, geysers, and fumaroles. Next, visit Yellowstone's Grand Canyon and its incredible Upper and Lower Falls, both encased in ice and snow as if frozen in time. This afternoon, a walk through historic Fort Yellowstone or along the boardwalk of the nearby hot springs will introduce us to this section of the park.

Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,D)

Day 4: Lamar Valley / Gardiner

After breakfast, an early departure brings us to prime wolf habitat, Lamar Valley. Aboard a heated van, venture into a winter wonderland where wolves and other wildlife play, hunt, and survive. Dusted with snow, bison stand majestically within this protected area, and elk gather in the river valleys. Wolves stay in range of the movements of their prey, and with the season's bare trees and frosty backdrops, conditions are better than any other time of year to spot the elusive predators. During this full-day safari, our driver and guide will share a wealth of knowledge, stories, and a trained eye to spot wildlife.

Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,D)

Day 5: Lamar Valley / Gardiner

Another full-day safari in Lamar Valley gives us the opportunity to reach viewing points where wolf sightings have been reported. Learn about the wolves' evolving family tree, the packs currently roaming the park, and the dynamics between individuals and families. Dramatic stories and perspectives about the saga of the wolves' demise and comeback over the last several decades add to this second day of scouting.

Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,D)

Day 6: Gardiner / Lamar Valley / Bozeman

This morning we make our final excursion to Lamar Valley. After lunch we say our goodbyes to Yellowstone National Park, passing the iconic Roosevelt Arch at the North Entrance on our way to Bozeman for a special evening. At the Museum of the Rockies, we finish our adventure with a festive farewell dinner amidst one of the most important collections of dinosaur fossils in the world. Learn about the discoveries made in this area from a knowledgeable guide—an exclusive after-hours tour that will set the scene for a fond farewell to the magnificent Yellowstone wildlife, the park, and your traveling companions.

Overnight: Homewood Suites by Hilton Bozeman (B,L,D)

Day 7: Depart Bozeman

After breakfast, depart for the airport. Complimentary transfers are available for flights departing during the suggested times. (B)

Activity Level:

Moderate

The majority of the program's activities will take place outdoors and a fair amount of walking on varying terrain is to be expected. Many of the dirt trails and boardwalks in Yellowstone are not routinely shoveled in the winter. **It is our expectation that guests on this program can manage cold temperatures; walk on uneven, frozen, or snow-covered terrain; as well as have the ability to get in and out of all-terrain vehicles and manage stairs without**

assistance. There are opportunities for differing abilities to enjoy Yellowstone National Park. Also keep in mind that you will experience varying altitudes, from 5,282 to 8,391 feet.

Maximum elevation: 8,391 feet at the Continental Divide

JACKSON PRE-TOUR



Located in the southern end of Jackson Hole Valley and just 60 miles from Yellowstone National Park, the charming town of Jackson is a four-seasons destination with historic boardwalks, antler arches, endless scenery, and abundant outdoor activities. Choose from optional activities like showshoeing, snowmobiling, and skiing, or other tamer pursuits such as exploring art galleries and shops, or sampling local fare at one of many superb restaurants.

Day 2: National Museum of Wildlife Art

Take a private, docent-led guided tour of the museum—designated the "National Museum of Wildlife Art of the United States" by order of Congress—situated on a distinct cliff that overlooks the National Elk Refuge. Outdoors you may spot for wildlife before entering inside to view some of the pieces within the collection of over 5,000 from more than 550 artists. The rich artwork dates from 2500 BCE to the present and features the history of wildlife in art form, including the European exploration of the American West. This afternoon and evening are at your leisure.

Day 3: Jackson Hole / National Elk Refuge Sleigh Ride / Main Program Begins

This Agreement is important. It includes contractual terms and conditions and releases Orbridge, LLC from liability. It must be signed by all participants.

Responsibility. Orbridge, its shareholders, directors, officers, employees and affiliates (collectively, "Orbridge"), does not own or operate any entity which is to or does provide goods or services for your trip including, for example, ownership or control over hotels or other lodging facilities, airline, vessel, bus, van or other transportation companies, local ground operators, providers or organizers of optional excursions or equipment used thereon, food service or entertainment providers, etc., even if they use the "Orbridge" name. All such persons and entities are independent contractors. As a result, Orbridge is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or entity, or of any other third party. Without limitation, Orbridge is not responsible for any injury, loss, or damage to person or property, death, delay or inconvenience in connection with the provision of any goods or services occasioned by or resulting from, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of government, force majeure, acts of war or civil unrest, insurrection or revolt, strikes or other labor activities, criminal or terrorist activities of any kind, or the threat thereof, overbooking or downgrading of accommodations, structural or other defective conditions in hotels or other lodging facilities, mechanical or other failure of airplanes or other means of transportation or for any failure of any transportation mechanism to arrive or depart timely or safely, dangers associated with or bites from animals, pests or insects, marine life or vegetation of any sort, dangers incident to recreational activities such as scuba diving, snorkeling, paddle boarding, surfing, swimming, kayaking, sailing, canoeing, rafting, hiking, bicycling, rock climbing, etc., sanitation problems, food poisoning, lack of access to or quality of medical care, difficulty in evacuation in case of a medical or other emergency, illness, epidemics or the threat thereof or for any other cause beyond the direct control of Orbridge. Rates. Program rates are based on minimum participation levels, current fares (air, water, land), tariffs and currency values. While Orbridge does everything possible to maintain the listed program rates, they are subject to change effective immediately upon posting unless otherwise specified by Orbridge. In the case of invoicing errors, we reserve the right to re-invoice with the correct pricing.

Registration, Deposits and Final Payment. To confirm and secure your reservation, a deposit of \$1,700 per person is due for the Astounding Antarctica program. A deposit of \$850 per person and \$500 per person per extension is required for all other programs. Reservation deposits, plus any non-refundable deposits are due at the time of registration and payable by check, ACH, money order, wire transfer of same day U.S. funds, or major credit card. Final payment including any extension(s) and optional(s) is payable by check, ACH, money order, wire transfer of same day U.S. funds and due no later than 120 days prior to Antarctica program departure dates. Final payments for all other programs are due 90 days prior to the scheduled program departure date. If your reservation is made between the final payment due date and the date the program starts, the entire cost of the program, plus any extension and optional(s), is due at the time of registration by check, money order, ACH or wire transfer of same day U.S. funds. Final payments made by credit card are subject to a 2% transaction fee. If final payment is not received by Orbridge by the final payment due date, Orbridge may, at any time and with or without notice, cancel your reservation in its sole discretion with no right of refund.

Reservation Grace Period. Reservations (other than for the Rwanda Extension on the Tanzania Safari Migration program) made not fewer than 128 calendar days prior to the scheduled program departure date for Astounding Antarctica, and not fewer than 98 calendar days prior to the scheduled program departure date for other Orbridge programs may be canceled at any time during the seven (7) calendar day period (the "Grace Period") immediately following the date of reservation for a full refund of all Payments received by Orbridge as of the effective date of termination. Notice of termination must be in writing, must be received by Orbridge in the Grace Period and is effective only on timely receipt of such written notice by Orbridge. For all other reservations and cancellations, the terms of the Cancellations and Refunds section below apply.

Cancellations and Refunds. All cancellations must be submitted to Orbridge in writing and will be subject to a cancellation fee ("Cancellation Fee") as follows: (a) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge 275 or more calendar days prior to the scheduled departure date, all deposits, other than for the Rwanda Extension on the Tanzania Safari Migration program, will be fully refunded; (b) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge between 274 and 151 days prior to the scheduled departure date, the Cancellation Fee will be \$500 per person per program and \$300 per person per program for any extension other than Rwanda; (c) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge between 150 days prior to the scheduled departure date and the day before the final payment due date, the Cancellation Fee will be the full deposit per person per program including any extension; (d) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge on the final payment due date or closer to the scheduled departure date, the Cancellation Fee will be the full program price.
